Developing Global Standards for Occupational Health Physiotherapy (OHP) practice

A small working party is meeting regularly to discuss the development of global standards for OHP practice, using the newly developed World Physiotherapy Educational Framework as a reference document in addition to existing standards from some countries. For time-zone convenience, the working party is divided into Northern and Southern Hemisphere groups, and includes physios from: Australia, Brazil, Colombia and New Zealand (Southern Hemisphere), and Finland, Greece, The Netherlands and the United Kingdom (Northern Hemisphere). This work will continue in 2023.

Healthy Workplaces Lighten the Load Summit 2022
